A GUIDE TO MAKING A COUNTY RECORD CLAIM

The things to remember when wanting to submit a claim for a new county record:

- You must have shot your round at an **open** competition. Rounds shot at a club night or in practice **will not** count. The only exception to this is closed events that are run as a World/UK record status event, such as the County Indoor Championships.
- You must have shot your **age-appropriate** round or higher. For example, a senior lady recurve could submit a claim for her age appropriate “Hereford” round but could also submit a claim (if she felt brave enough!) for the further distance “York” round. She wouldn’t however, be able to claim for the Bristol 2 round as this is below her age-appropriate round. This also includes rounds shot at Heritage shoots. You **must** be shooting your age appropriate “National” round to claim a county record.
- It is very easy to make a claim via the link on the Shropshire County website (<https://www.shropshirearcherysociety.co.uk/records>). Complete your personal details, bow and round information, score and competition details and finally copy and paste a link to the official results. If you do not have a link, for instance if the organisers have emailed you a copy, you can upload them from your computer instead.
- Once your claim has been ratified you will receive a certificate via email and the website will be updated. A report of all new county records will be submitted at each Shropshire County meeting, as well an annual report that will be submitted at the county AGM and distributed to club secretaries.
